Barry Delano Bradford, Sr., 91, of Trussville, Alabama died peacefully at home on October 20, 2024. He was born March 27, 1933 in Lovick, Alabama to Floyd Alton Bradford and Maizie Odetta White Bradford. Barry attended Jones Valley High School where he was a cheerleader and later studied pre-law at the University of Alabama. He served in the US Army from 1954 to 1956 and was assigned to the cryptography platoon in Germany before returning home to his family. He had a 30 plus year career at Mayer Electric in Birmingham, Alabama where he worked as the data processing manager. After retiring, he spent many hours on the road delivering “underground furniture” for Aurora Casket Company in Leeds, Alabama. Everyone who knew Barry, knew how much he loved his motorcycles. He was a member of the Christian Motorcyclists Association for many years and was actively involved in their prison ministry and at the Boys and Girls Ranch of Alabama.
