



Rev. Charles Frankie Anglin

June 10, 1943 - July 19, 2017

The Rev. Charles Frankie Anglin went to be with the Lord on July 19, 2017. He was 74 years old and a resident of Pinson, Ala. He is survived by his wife, Diane Lyn (née: Weller), daughters Vicki (Jim) Battan of Hoover, Ala., Kristi (Bruce) Rogers of Hueytown, Ala., Becki (Thomas) Gullo of Warrior, Ala., and sister Nancy (Tony) Ustinowich of Ocala, Fla. Rev. Anglin had five grandchildren and two great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, Charles Brown and Frankie Mae (née: Westbrooks) of Buford, Ga., and brother Barry Patrick Anglin of Macon, Ga. Rev. Anglin was born in Miami, Fla., at Jackson Memorial Hospital on June 10, 1943, and grew up in Hialeah, Fla. He graduated from Hialeah High School and later joined the United States Air Force in 1962. He was honorably discharged in 1966. Rev. Anglin graduated from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary in 1980. Rev. Anglin's first church as pastor was Shiloh Baptist Church (Amite, La.). Later, he was pastor at Cedar Grove Baptist Church (Columbia, Miss.), and then Oak Grove First Baptist Church (Bessemer, Ala.). After Rev. Anglin's retirement, he served for a time as interim pastor at Concord Baptist Church (Concord, Ala.).

Rev. Anglin had a genuine commitment to the ministry and the people he served as pastor. He was passionate about leading others to Christ. He especially realized the importance of church visitation, consistently visiting church members, the sick, elderly, and anyone who needed him. An example

of his unique and dedicated way with others, he began a tradition that he did for years. Whenever a church member had a baby, he always took a flower to the mother, and a second flower (either blue or pink) to the newborn when he visited the hospital. It was his way of marking the celebration of birth. Rev. Anglin was also actively involved in church mission trips, including two to Honduras. Rev. Anglin was a stellar athlete in his youth and loved sports, especially football and the University of Miami Hurricanes and the Miami Dolphins. He had a gregarious personality and never met a stranger. He also had a keen sense of humor which drew people to him. Never a wallflower, he was the life of any party. For those who knew him, he was the kindest, most loving friend, confidant, and champion.

There will be a viewing on Saturday, July 29, 2017, from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM and funeral ceremony at 4:00 PM at Deerfoot Memorial Funeral Home (5360 Deerfoot Parkway, Trussville, Ala.). A graveside service with military funeral honors will be held on Monday, July 31, 2017 at 1:15 PM at the Alabama National Cemetery (3133 Highway 119, Montevallo, Ala.).
