Steve graduated from Baker High School and attended the University of South Alabama.

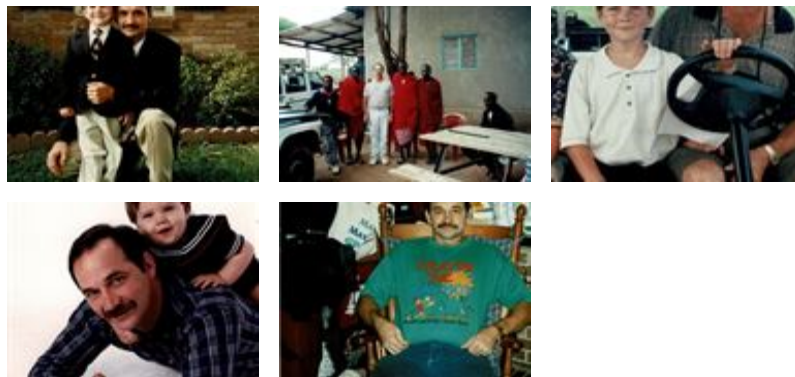
