Diane Lyn (Weller) Anglin passed away peacefully on March 28, 2021. She was a resident of Pinson, Ala. Mrs. Anglin was born in Helena, Ark., on October 27, 1945, and grew up in Henderson, Nev. Mrs. Anglin is survived by three daughters, Vicki (Jim) Battan of Hoover, Ala., Kristi (Bruce) Fields Rogers of Pinson, Ala., and Becki (Tom) Gullow of Pinson, Ala. She is also survived by two brothers, George (Debbie) Weller of Henderson, Nev., and Dick (Manchie) Weller of Amarillo, Tex. Mrs. Anglin had five grandchildren and three great grandchildren, and a beloved rescue dog. She is preceded in death by her husband, Rev. Charles Frankie Anglin, parents, Richard and Jeanette (Nick) Weller, and brother, Michael Weller.

Mrs. Anglin met her husband when he was serving in the United States Air Force, after first being 'Pen Pals.' They were married on June 12, 1963. Mrs. Anglin moved with her husband and daughters many times throughout their lives, including Hollywood, Fla., Henderson, Nev., Kenai, Alaska, New Orleans, La., Columbia, Miss., and Birmingham, Ala.

Mrs. Anglin had a number of jobs throughout her lifetime including a switchboard operator, daycare worker, medical transcriptionist, and teacher. She was a dutiful wife and mother, who committed herself to working in order to help support her family. When her husband went into the church ministry, she was a Sunday School teacher who also sang in the church choir.

Mrs. Anglin's daughters recall her dressing them in their pajamas for bed when they were young, piling them in the back of their Toyota Corolla station wagon with pillows and blankets, and her and her husband driving them up and down the Las Vegas Strip. This was done in order to get the girls to go to sleep. Once asleep, they drove home and she and her husband put their daughters to bed. Now it is a very fond memory for her daughters.

In her prime, Mrs. Anglin had impeccable style and beauty. She could make a grand entrance as well as any Hollywood movie star; her smile would light up a room. One can only imagine her walking through the gates of heaven. There she is, absolutely gorgeous, being greeted by her husband, parents, brother, family and friends, but especially by her Lord & Savior, Jesus Christ.
