James Albert "Bert/Grampy" Farmer, age 75, went to be with the Lord on April 29th, 2026. Bert was a resident of Trussville, AL from 2017 until 2025, when he moved to Gallatin, TN. He also lived in Memphis, TN, Charlotte, NC, Ridgeland, MS, and Charleston, MO.

Bert was born to Jesse and Jane Farmer of Charleston, MO on November 12, 1950. He graduated from Charleston High School and then went on to Lambuth College, earning a Bachelor's degree in Business. After graduation, he worked for International Harvester Credit Corporation until 1985 and then worked for Chrysler Financial and TD Auto Finance until his retirement in 2015. After his retirement, Bert and Sue moved from Ridgeland, MS to Trussville, AL to be closer to Jeff, Catie, and Jill and the six grandchildren.

Bert is survived by his son, Jeff Farmer of Trussville, AL, wife Wendy, and children Jack and Atley; daughter Catie Hastings of Gallatin, TN, husband Clark, and children Gavin and Lawson; and daughter Jill White of McDonough, GA, husband Levi, and children Owen and Leila. After his retirement, they would drive down to Apalachicola just to eat oysters, or travel to the Smoky Mountains for a quick getaway.

For example a group of Jeff's high school friends, when they learned of Bert's passing, said he was "definitely a legend." 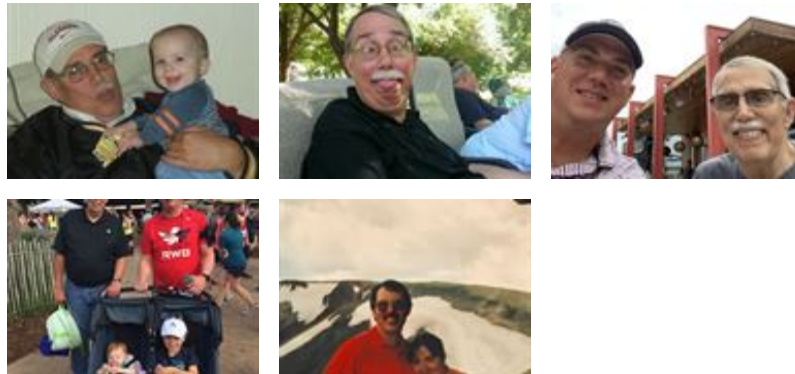
