Terry was many things to many people, but some of the highlights were that

he was a passionate golfer, lover of old-style country music (think Hank Williams and the Grand Ole Opry of years ago), husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, friend, and extremely valuable hardworker. He was a self-employed land developer, and of course, he was a devoted dog lover and owner. His last dog was his beloved, Buttercup. A proud American, Terry was always ready to show his love of country and how proud he was of his two grandsons that are currently serving in our military. Those two grandsons are Mikel Owen Scharf of the United States Air Force and Casey Robert Tittle of the United States Army. Since Terry was close to retiring, he had recently bought a large RV camper. He had planned for he and the love of his life, Carolyn, to start travelling around the U.S. He had only recently turned 73 when he unexpectedly passed on October 2nd. Terry was born August 7, 1947 to the late Era Mae Adkins and Chester Sylvester Tittle. He was the younger brother to the recently deceased Rodney Tittle (Shirley), older brother to Steve Tittle of Argo, and uncle to his deceased niece, Sara Beth Tittle. Terry was blessed to have been part of a loving family. His wife of the last 53 years is Carolyn Putman Tittle. Terry and Carolyn were married in 1966 and enjoyed a wonderfully happy lifetime together that was filled with love and laughter. Terry was truly loved.
