



Sue Mathews Farmer

Sue went to be with the Lord on February 24, 2019 after a year long battle with various types of cancer. She is survived by her husband of 45 years, James (Bert) Farmer of Trussville; brother, James Mathews of Memphis, TN; son, Jeff Farmer (Wendy) of Trussville; daughters, Catie Hastings (Clark) of Gallatin, TN and Jill White (Levi) of McDonough, GA. She is also survived by her six grandchildren, Gavin (10), Lawson (9), Owen (9), Leila (8), Jack (7) and Atley (3). She was also loved by many other family members and friends.

Sue was born and raised in Memphis, TN. She graduated from Messick High School, then earned her Bachelor of Arts degree from Lambuth College in Jackson, TN. She married Bert Farmer on January 12, 1974. Sue and Bert started their family in Memphis, TN, but eventually moved to Charlotte, NC, returned to Memphis, and then lived in Ridgeland, MS for 30 years. After Sue and Bert retired, they decided to move to Trussville in June 2017 to be closer to their six grandchildren.

Sue loved being outdoors. She enjoyed camping with the family, kayaking, waterskiing, and swimming with the manatees in Florida. Sue was also an accomplished artist, working in various mediums to include painting, clay, knitting and cake decorating.

Sue was a lifelong Girl Scout, earning her Gold Award as a youth member,

leading troops for both Catie and Jill, and working for and retiring with the Girl Scout Council of Middle Mississippi.

Jeff was one of the first people to talk to me when I moved to Mississippi and we've been friends ever since (28 years!). The Farmers opened their home to me, whether it was a bite to eat or a game of pickup basketball in the driveway, they were always there. I have such fond memories of hanging out at their house with Jeff, watching basketball or football, picking up Subway sandwiches for the crew (whoever happened to be at the house), and talking with Bert and Sue. There was always a lot going on, funny stories, games, cases of Girl Scout cookies, and the infamous chicken pillow. Sue was always at the heart of it. She didn't say much, but when she did, you listened. She had a way of being contemplative and gentle, but still direct. Looking back on it all, she and Bert were such a great, complimentary team as parents for their own kids and for all of us, their friends.

One of the things I learned from the Farmers was the value of (a tight-knit) family. I was always impressed by how much the five of them (Bert, Sue, Jeff, Catie, Jill) spent time together and got along. There were many days on the weekends Jeff couldn't hang out with friends because they had a family day planned. Even 20 years ago, that was pretty rare. But Bert and Sue always stuck to their plans to do things as a family, just the five of them. Now as a parent, the Farmers are one of the contributors to my family's culture; we have dinner together most nights, plan family trips, and have pizza and movie night on Fridays, etc.

Bert, Jeff, Catie, and Jill, we're so sorry for your loss. We love y'all and you're in our prayers.

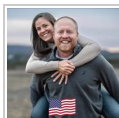

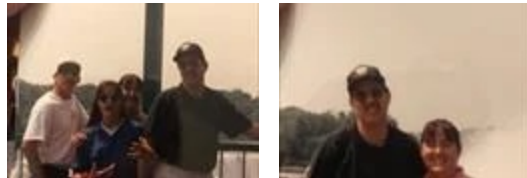
