



## Travis Woodson Jones

Travis Woodson Jones, age 83, of Gadsden, Alabama, passed away surrounded by family. Born on September 24, 1942, in Chattanooga, Tennessee, Travis lived a life marked by devotion, quiet strength, and a deep love for the people he cared for.

He was the son of Harry Lee Jones and Georgia (Morgan) Jones, and is survived by his brother Mickey Jones. He was preceded in death by his brothers Bob Jones, Bud Jones, and Bill Jones. He is survived by his wife of 58 years, Joyce Jones; his sons Wayne Jones (Cecelia) and David Jones (Tiffany); grandchildren Emilee, Lauren, Jack, Ashton, Noah, and Macie; and great-grandchildren Jett, Cash, Jovi, and Rennan, with another great-grandchild on the way through Jack and Haley.

Travis and Joyce also opened their home as foster parents to many children over the years. One who remained especially close is Jennifer, who married Joey Gray. Their children — AnnaKate, Addison, and Brantley — continued to be part of the family's life and story.

Travis will be remembered for his steady spirit, his quiet humor, his love for the outdoors, and the way he showed his devotion through action more than words. His legacy lives on in the skills he taught, the stories he created, and the family he loved so deeply.
